

Emergency Housing
Notice of Change
Effective September 23, 2021

This is to notify interested persons that on September 21, 2021 a 30 day “pause” of the Emergency Housing Program began. The “pause” means anyone who reaches the 84-day maximum during this period will not be exited from the program, as long as all other eligibility criteria are met.

Important Information

- ESD will be reaching out to clients or the hotel/motel to extend stays during the “pause.” If you haven’t heard from ESD give us a call at 1-800-479-6151
- Once a household reaches its 84 day maximum, if it would like to exit Emergency Housing they may be eligible for a \$2,500 essential payment to assist with permanent housing. Call ESD at the number above or stop into a district office for more information.
- During the “pause” a household planning to request a waiver of the 84 day maximum, should continue to submit the proper documentation to ESD for determination (This applies to families and people who have a disability which significantly impair activities of daily living (ADL) or if you receive Choices for Care; developmental services; CRT; brain injury program; or attendant services.)
- A household that is still within the 84 days of Emergency Housing, may still have an income contribution requirement. There is no income contribution during the “pause” if the household has exhausted the 84 day maximum.
- This “pause” will end on October 21, 2021.

RIGHT TO A FAIR HEARING:

If you disagree with a decision we made, you may ask for a fair hearing. The HumanServices Board will:

- Hold a hearing within 10 days (usually).
- Listen to your side of the story.
- Review the facts fairly and objectively.
- Decide if the decision should be upheld or reversed.

You must ask for a fair hearing within 90 days of getting a notice. To do so, call ESD at 1-800- 479-6151 or the Human Services Board at (802) 828-2536. You can get someone you trust to help you.

RIGHTS OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES:

If you have a disability, you may be entitled to free aids & services to help you get benefits. This is called a *reasonable accommodation*. Examples include:

- Having someone write your answers down.
- Giving you documents in other formats. For example: large print, audio, or Braille.
- Having a support person with you when you talk to us.
- Meeting in your home or by phone.
- Giving you more time to get us the documents we need.
