

P-2211 OUT-OF-STATE TANF MONTHS (con't)

P-2211B Initial Benefit When Out of State TANF Already Received (Reach Up rule 2233) (19-12)

If a Reach Up applicant states that they have already received a TANF benefit from another state in the same month they are applying for Reach Up, they may still be eligible for Reach Up in that month, if the benefit amount was lower in the state they moved from.

Determining the amount of Out of State TANF benefit

Use information provided from the other state. See P-2211A for more information about verifying information). If the information is not returned by the other state, ask the applicant to self report the amount of TANF they already received for the month from the other state.

Determining Eligibility for Reach Up Initial benefit

Enter one-time unearned income panel (UNEA) for the amount of benefit received in other state for the month it was received. Then approve benefits, which may either reduce the Reach Up benefit in first month or make them not eligible in that month, but eligible in subsequent months.

The UNEA is countable for Reach Up, 3SVT and Fuel.
