

Policy

Woodside is committed to maintaining an environment that will protect the health and safety of residents, staff and visitors at all times. To that end the following sanitation and hygiene standards will be met.

Sanitation and Health Codes

Woodside will comply with all federal, state and local health codes. The Vermont Department of Health will conduct annual inspections of Woodside to ensure that those codes continue to be met.

Water Supply

Woodside is supplied with water through the Champlain Water District, which is responsible for ensuring that all water delivered to Chittenden County homes and businesses meets all Federal and State standards. In addition, bottled spring water is available for drinking for staff and residents in the Woodside dining room, units and in the administrative area.

Waste Disposal

Waste disposal is the responsibility of the Village of Essex Junction and subject to Federal and State regulations designed to maintain the safety of the public. Waste material does not need to be collected and stored on the premises, although Buildings and General Services does operate a pumping system to move waste material up the hill and into the Essex Junction system. The interior Woodside waste disposal system will be maintained at all times by Buildings and General Services and any problems will be addressed immediately. An alarm system is maintained to alert the front desk operator immediately if there is a backup in the system

Control of Vermin

Buildings and General Services has a permanent employee who is responsible for addressing all problems involving rodents, insects and other vermin in all State buildings. Woodside will immediately contact that individual whenever necessary to address ants, mice, or any other vermin that appear to be in the building. Residents and staff will be advised whenever spraying is necessary, and steps will be taken to ensure that no one is exposed to chemicals that might be harmful.
